The Mayor's report of this year's March Visit to Bad Salzdetfurth

This year's official visit by Councillors Marshall, Monk and Perks was eventful in that concerns regarding the possible demise of twinning came from both Yate and Bad Salzdetfurth.

After flying from Birmingham to Hannover the intrepid trio were collected and delivered to their hosts, the Kösters, Ottlebens and Nipps. The afternoon was spent recovering with the aid of food, beer and schnapps and undertaking strenuous discussions with the Chair of the Partnerschaft.

Saturday brought the 'Welcome' in the Rathaus with speeches from both Mayor and Bürgermeister. The English version delivered by the Mayor had been translated by Alan Spiller and Fiona Blair, with addendums being translated on the spot by Margaret Marshall. Next year's visit to Yate will have as its theme 'Wohin mit der Partnerschaft?'.

All ideas on how to keep twinning alive will be gratefully accepted and discussed in depth, hopefully we will succeed. One idea discussed with the Chair of the Partnerschaft is expanded elsewhere in this newsletter—it has been the topic of discussion by the Committee.

In the afternoon a visit was made to Hameln where a big festival was taking place.

On Sunday after visits to several local 'Schlösser' with historical and political commentary by Dr Freddy Köster we adjourned to the Bavaria Inn, where we were met by the Bürgermeister and other local dignitaries, for lunch. Later on I visited a new build in the village of Gross Düngen; a completely different development to that proposed at Yate. Perhaps we could learn from the German way of providing new houses!

On Monday before boarding the return flight we had a short visit to Hannover Town Hall, the old town and a new shopping centre, returning to Yate by 18.00.

A fresh wind of change for Town Twinning

Anglo-German link looks to develop new format

Is it all over for the Twinning link between Yate and Bad Salzdetfurth? It's not only the youngsters showing a lack of interest – older residents are also only showing a limited interest in the intertown activities. Even the regular coach trips, for which Werner Krause used to be able to drum up a healthy number of participants, are no longer taking place. In the end, it was difficult even for him to fill a minibus.

Both sides, however, maintain that there is no way they want to see the 28-year old friendship link fade away. They hope that the winds of change will reinvigorate the link. So this year there will be a new development: more than 30 people from the Bad Salzdetfurth area will set off on the trip to England. The new thing this year is that the group will be spending several days in Cornwall, getting to know the splendid scenery. Apart from a small group, they will only be spending a couple of days in Yate.

The Mayor of Yate, Martin Monk, would have preferred everyone to stay in the Yate area — he stressed the value of promoting friendship between families. "We must look for new ways to promote the twinning — otherwise we risk losing it all!" said the town mayor at the annual meeting between the two councils, which was hosted in Bad Salzdetfurth this year.

The mayor suggested that next year's joint meeting should concern itself exclusively with the way forward for the friendship link. Reinhard Nipp, however, said that as Chairman of the Bad Salzdetfurth "Partnerschaft" he saw advantages in this year's planned visit. "The idea of splitting the time in England is a good one- about 30 people are going to the UK – with their visit I don't think that Yate is coming off too badly." State Councillor Reiner Wegner, who also attended the joint meeting, said that it was not a bad idea: "This is an interesting option." After all, it's not easy to drum up new enthusiasm.

In addition there is the problem that hardly anyone now wants to stay with host families. On the school exchange there are new people taking part every year, said Mr Nipp, but that doesn't make matters any easier. He himself has no concern about the continued existence of the Twinning.

Rolf Jakobs, the town official with responsibility for youth and cultural matters, said that he could imagine an English artist coming to work in Bad Salzdetfurth for a period of time. He was also able to announce that here have been suggestions of a tennis player link with Yate. Negotiations are still on-going, with hope of a decision in the near future. There are still a couple of things to be clarified.

Bad Salzdetfurth's mayor, Erich Schaper, welcomed the public discussions: "Even among friends we must face uncomfortable truths." Both sides would have to admit that they have not been successful in attracting young people to the Twinning. He emphasised that there would have to be full and meaningful preparations for the meeting next year, saying: "That is the only way we can produce concrete suggestions for the way forward."
